Yaka Dandjoo's Last Cohort Graduates

The 13th and final cohort of graduates from the Yaka Dandjoo ready-for-work training program celebrated their completion of the program last month.

Since its inception in September 2021, the program has seen 191 participants graduate. This includes 109 Aboriginal graduates (60 per cent) 104 female graduates (54 per cent), and 83 youth graduates (43 per cent).

Local business engagement update

As of 31 March 2024, the project has committed \$536.9 million in spend with local businesses, which is 24 per cent above the targeted spend of \$450 million. Of that committed spend, to date \$434.5 million has already been spent and 352 local businesses and suppliers have been engaged with.

Additionally, \$51.8 million of spend has been committed to the Aboriginal industry, which is 72 per cent per cent above the targeted spend of \$30 million.

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To date, \$40.3 million has been spent already with Aboriginal businesses and 43 Aboriginal businesses and suppliers have been engaged with.
