Construction update

The Wilman Wadandi Highway (the Bunbury Outer Ring Road project) has entered its final stages of construction and is preparing to open to traffic on 16 December 2024.

In early October, it was announced that the project will be named the Wilman Wadandi Highway once opened. The name honours the Wilman and Wadandi people, who have historically occupied the lands at either end of the project. Since February 2021, extensive consultation on the name has been underway with the project's Aboriginal Heritage Advisory Group, Local Government Authorities, the Noongar Language Centre and Landgate

Names play an important role in identifying the place, its stories and the history that surrounds it. Additionally, through this process, Aboriginal names for sections of the Collie, Preston and Ferguson Rivers have been identified and names have also been allocated for four local bridges within the project. The Paris Road and Clifton Road interchange is nearly complete, with a section of the bridge now open to traffic when Paris Road reopens.

At the Collie River bridges, the structures' construction is substantially finished, allowing for the final approach earthworks and pavement works to progress. Additionally, a maintenance access path and stairs have been installed.

Two key roadworks switches have also occurred recently, which has allowed our team to continue construction near high traffic areas. Firstly, Lillydale Road between Roselea Court and South Western Highway has been temporarily closed to allow construction of the new roundabout which intersects Lillydale Road, South Western Highway (south) and Willinge Drive. A detour is in place via a new section of the Bunbury Outer Ring Road.

Secondly, a small section of Discovery Road has been closed and a temporary diversion is in place on South Western Highway (north), with traffic signals in place to guide traffic through the one lane section.

of traffic lights and a rail level crossing between Bussell Highway and Forrest Highway and significantly improves freight efficiency by redirecting trucks from local roads. It enhances safety for all road users and reduces local congestion, providing more reliable journey times. In addition, you can expect travel time savings between the north and south of Bunbury, of around 11 to 18 minutes depending on your destination and traffic conditions.

To prepare for the opening of the highway we are hosting several community drop-in sessions where you can explore the new 'virtual' road network. The drop-in session times and locations are listed below.

Local and Aboriginal business spend update

As of 30 September 2024, the project has committed to spend \$539.3 million with local businesses and has an actual spend of \$595.3 million. The project's target spend of \$450 million was surpassed in April 2024.

\$56.5 million in spend has been committed to Aboriginal businesses with \$52.5 million spent to date. The project's target spend with Aboriginal businesses was \$30 million.
