

Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project Construction Update

This update contains important information about anticipated upcoming works to occur in December 2025 and January 2026 but are subject to change.

Estuary returned to normal conditions

Navigation conditions have returned to normal in the estuary following the removal of working barges and floating platforms from the water. Non-motorised vessels can access under the bridge either side of the main navigation channel. The 8-knot speed limit has also been reinstated. Yellow markers remain in the water to delineate the construction area.



Final amenity wall works

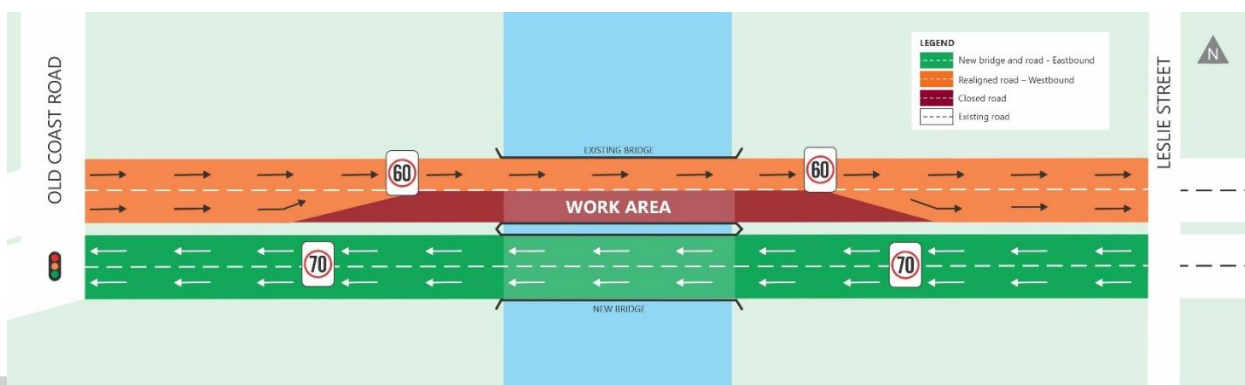
Amenity wall works will conclude, with the final panels installed to the northwest quadrant. A total of 789 panels will have been installed across the project and painting of the panels is ongoing.

Surface works to new bridge

Finishing works on the new bridge deck are underway with the installation of light poles and road furniture in December. Nightworks continue until early December to complete road finishing works ahead of asphalt application over the new bridge deck in the coming months.

Upcoming traffic switches 2026

Two traffic switches will occur in January 2026 to enable road surfacing and finishing works to the eastbound approach and median tie-in to the new approach. The first switch will shift merging traffic from the Old Coast Road intersection to the left-hand lane and continue in a single lane configuration to Leslie Street and A second switch will occur in early 2026. As part of this realignment westbound traffic from Leslie Street to Old Coast Road will drive on Bridge 1910 and the newly aligned approaches. Eastbound will remain in a single lane.



Working outside of normal hours

Approved out of hours works may occur throughout December 2025 and January 2026 to support critical construction activities, mainly pavement works. Split shifts between 5:00am – 9:00pm may be required to perform crane operations, and bituminous pavement work. These works may also occur on Sundays, if necessary, but subject to weather conditions.

Christmas site closure

The Project will pause construction activities from 5pm on Friday 19 December 2025 and recommence on Monday 5 January 2026. Full-time traffic management and security will be the only activities performed during this shut-down. What can I expect throughout December and January?

Waterside Drive (Northeast)

- Works on the new fishing platform car park and the associated median on Waterside Drive.

Waterlily Drive (Southeast)

- Ongoing deliveries, collections and site operations.
- Completion of the new fishing platform and new car park.
- Road pavement construction for the new westbound road tie in and maintenance access to the median crossover. This will also include completion of the street lighting electrical works.
- Widening of the footpath to tie in with the 4m-wide shared path that runs under the new bridge.
- Finishing works including the eastern foreshore yarning circle.

Seahawk Drive (Southwest)

- Asphaltting works along the new bridge alignment.
- Finishing works

Leisure Way/Egret Point Road area (Northwest)

- Post and panel install to complete the amenity wall near the intersection of Old Coast Road.

Further information

Funded by the Australian and Western Australian Governments, the \$148.8 million Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project is delivering a second, two-lane bridge on the south side of the existing structure, increasing connectivity, reducing congestion, and improving road user safety.

The Project also enhances the location as a recreational area, delivering an accessible fishing platform, yarning circles on both eastern and western foreshores, an improved accessible shared path network, programmable feature lighting, and urban design elements.
