Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project Construction Update

This update contains important information about anticipated upcoming works to occur in November but are subject to change.

Waterside Reserve playground reinstatement

Works to reinstate the children's playground at Waterside Reserve will begin in early November with a new playground design that will enhance the local amenity and family-friendly appeal of the area.

The new playground features a range of freestanding and inclusive play elements designed for children of all ages to play, explore, and connect. Highlights include sensory panels and play activities, monkey bars and climbing structures, a variety of swings such as a bird's nest and serpent rope swing, and a 25-metre zipline.

Waterside Drive fence realignment

From early November, the existing boundary and temporary construction fencing along Waterside Drive will be removed following community feedback. The noise wall will serve as the new boundary, with the mesh boundary fence removed to the cleared area and a new section of fencing installed perpendicular to the noise wall and existing fence line.

Working outside of normal hours

Approved out of hours works may occur throughout November 2025 to support critical construction activities before. Split shifts between 5:00am – 9:00pm may be required to complete concrete pours, crane operations, and bituminous pavement work. These works may also occur on Sundays if necessary, subject to weather conditions.

What can I expect in November?

Waterside Drive (Northeast)

- Reinstatement and installation of children's playground equipment.
- Works on the future fishing platform car park.
- Removal of boundary fence to end of cleared area
- Installation of temporary fencing at bridge abutment to complete finishing works.
- Installation of permanent balustrade on the existing fishing platform

Waterlily Drive (Southeast)

- Ongoing deliveries and general crane and forklift operations.
- Construction of the eastern approach slab (onto the new bridge) and completion of the new fishing platform.
- Road pavement construction for the new westbound road tie in and maintenance access median crossover. This will also include associated drainage and electrical works.
- Completion of the noise walls.
- Anti-graffiti painting.
- Drainage and embankment construction.
- Widening of the footpath to tie in with the 4m-wide shared path that runs under the new bridge.

Seahawk Drive (Southwest)

- Reinstatement of the bus stop after Mandurah Estuary Bridge
- Roadworks, bituminous surfacing (asphalt application) and associated road furniture construction including street lighting and barrier works.
- Installation of pram ramp and crossing to footpath connection to Mandurah Road.
- Anti-graffiti painting.
- Box culvert pavement tie-in to Seahawk Drive.
- Precast panel construction for new bridge abutment.

Leisure Way/Egret Point Road area (Northwest)

- Egret Point Road closure until 8 November 2025.
- Concrete agitator truck/pump works at the western bridge abutment.
- Finishing works within the western foreshore, rock pitching and installation of the permanent fence and gates.
- Amenity wall construction near the intersection of Old Coast Road.
- Painting of remaining pier mural

In the estuary

- Finishing works to the new fishing platform - installation of handrail, ladders, and platform furniture.
- Removal of eastern reclamation pad.
- Barges will be working in the water with no impact to the navigation channel.
- Anti-graffiti painting to the piers.
- Ongoing removal of scaffolding and temporary walkways from the pier columns.
- Vessel Management Plan remains in place with reduced width of navigation channel and a 5-knot speed limit including any general maintenance required to the channel markers/buoys.

Further information

Funded by the Australian and Western Australian Governments, the \$148.8 million Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project is delivering a second, two-lane bridge on the south side of the existing structure, increasing connectivity, reducing congestion, and improving road user safety.

The Project also enhances the location as a recreational area, delivering an accessible fishing platform, yarning circles on both eastern and western foreshores, an improved accessible shared path network, programmable feature lighting, and urban design elements.
