



Stephenson Avenue Extension Phase 2 – Stirling Station southern car park disruption

The Stephenson Avenue Extension (Phase 2) project will provide a new connection from Scarborough Beach Road to Cedric Street, including a new grade-separated interchange with the Mitchell Freeway to replace the existing Cedric Street interchange, and local road links to Ellen Stirling Boulevard. The S2M Evolution Alliance is delivering the project in partnership with Main Roads.

The project will also be upgrading the Stirling Bus Interchange from an 18-stand facility to a modern 30-stand facility, increasing transport options in the area. This includes upgrading the Stirling Station southern car park to improve access and movements through the car park.

To allow for upgrades, the Stirling Station southern car park will completely close to facilitate construction works from **Wednesday 5 February 2025**.

During the closure, alternative temporary parking will continue to be provided for public transport passengers at 3 Tassels Place and additional parking will be provided at 7 Sunray Drive, Innaloo for public transport passengers during the closure.

When will the Stirling Station southern car park close?

A section of the southern car park and the motorbike shelter was closed on Thursday, 10 October 2024.

From Wednesday 5 February, we will completely close the southern station car park to continue upgrade works.

Why is the southern station car park closing?

The southern station car park will completely close as part of the upgrades to the Stirling Bus Interchange, which includes the construction of a new pedestrian concourse between Stirling Station and upgrades to the southern station car park to improve access and movements through the car park.

How long will the car park remain closed?

It is anticipated that Stage 1 of the car park is expected to be completed in mid-2025. More information will be provided for the next stage of construction.

Will the bike shelter in the southern car park still be available for use?

Yes. Passengers can still utilise the bike shelter in the southern car park.

Will the motorbike shelter in the southern car park still be available for use?

No. The motorbike shelter will be closed while the southern car park is upgraded.

Will there be any disruptions to the Stirling Station northern car park?

No. The Stirling Station northern car park will remain accessible to Transperth passengers throughout the closure.

Is alternative parking provided to impacted public transport passengers?

Yes. Alternative car parking will be provided at **3 Tassels Place and 7 Sunray Drive**, west of Stirling Station, at no cost to public transport passengers.

Both car parks are easily accessible via Ellen Stirling Boulevard.

Why is parking free at Tassels Place and Sunray Drive but not at the other Stirling Station car park?

The alternative car parks are privately operated by the S2ME Alliance. It is not managed by Transperth.

Will ACROD parking bays be provided in the alternative car parks?

No. ACROD parking bays have temporarily relocated east of the southern station car park.

Will Drop Off – Pick Up bays be provided in the alternative car parks?

No. Drop Off – Pick Up bays have temporarily relocated east of the southern station car park.

Will the alternative car parks be available for public parking once works in the southern car park are finished?

No. The Tassels Place and Sunray Drive car parks will only be available for public transport passenger parking while the southern station car park is closed.

How will passengers access Stirling Station from the alternative car parks?

Pedestrians can access Stirling Station via the temporary pedestrian footpath from the Tassels Place and Sunray Drive car parks. Passengers accessing Stirling Station from this car park should allow for additional travel time.

Will the alternative car parks be open on weekends and public holidays?

Yes.

How long can I park in the alternative car parks?

Parking is available 24/7. However, parking there is at your own risk. The S2ME Alliance is not responsible or liable for any theft or damages to vehicles, equipment, or contents at any time.

Can the public park in the alternative car parks?

Parking in the Tassels Place and Sunray Drive car parks is only provided for public transport passengers. IKEA currently leases a section of the Tassels Place car park for staff parking.
