Aboriginal businesses on BORR


Welcome to another edition of the Aboriginal Businesses on Bunbury Outer Ring Road (BORR) newsletter. Even though the end-of-year is fast approaching, there are still opportunities for Aboriginal businesses to get involved on the project. This newsletter will help you find out about awarded packages and upcoming procurement opportunities, as well as recent business engagement across the project.

Aboriginal business engagement update

As of November 2023, with just over a year left until the project is scheduled to be completed, we are proud to announce that we have already hit our targeted spend with Aboriginal businesses.

As of 31 October, project engagement with Aboriginal businesses has reached \$49.1 million in committed spend and \$30 million in spend to date. The target spend set was \$30 million. Committed spend refers to contracts in place for work.

Of the 40 Aboriginal businesses and suppliers engaged with, 20 businesses received commitments in excess of \$50,000.

In addition to contract extensions for Aboriginal businesses providing drainage and plant hire services, the following business packages are due for release to the general market soon:

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Achievements with the Yaka Dandjoo Sustainable Employment Program

On Thursday 16 November, the Yaka Dandjoo Sustainable Employment Program celebrated its 12th cohort of graduates. This most recent group brings the total number of graduates since the program's inception, in October 2021, to 175.

The program is focused on providing professional training to prepare participants for entry into the workforce. The program is targeted to young people, people over 45 years of age, and women, and Aboriginal people who are unemployed or have never been employed.

For participants, Yaka Dandjoo can be life changing for them, their families, and their communities. The significant positive impact has also been reflected in some recent awards ceremonies.

At the recent Apprentice Employment Network (AEN) WA Awards, two Yaka Dandjoo graduates made the finalist list: Tanya Garlett, who was nominated for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Apprentice award, and Kylie Thorburn who was a finalist nominee for the Trainee of the Year award and winner of a 2023 Special Recognition Award.

Additionally, Jackie Graham, the Training Manager at the Southwest Gateway Alliance, was awarded the Achievement in Health, Safety & Social Responsibility award at the National Association of Women in Construction in Australia (NAWICA) ceremony. Congratulations to Tanya, Kylie, and Jackie.

We also used this opportunity to further promote the Yaka Dandjoo Program and share the exciting achievements of its graduates.

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Business spotlight: Karrak Designs

'Djeran' is the artwork that will be featured on the Yalinda Drive bridge abutments and screen wall. The creators are local Noongar Wardandi artists Dellas Bennell and Korrine Bennell-Yarran from Karrak Designs.

The rich colour palette of the art design features flowing bands of green and blue reflecting the local vegetation of the land and the flowing river systems, and the Noongar season of Djeran; the autumn period from April to May.


This season-inspired design is part of the larger design strategy developed in consultation with the Urban Design and Landscaping Focus Group and the Aboriginal Heritage Advisory Group for the project.

The artwork also features the Koomool, Western Ringtail Possum, the Karrak, forest red-tailed black cockatoo, and the Yorgam, Red Flowering Gum Tree.


"Our design process was to select an animal and a plant that was not only significant to Wardandi Country, but also to us artists," said Dellas and Korrine in reflection of their design. The design will be seen by thousands of commuters each week when the new Bunbury Outer Ring Road opens.
