



Mitchell Freeway Off-Ramp to Neerabup Road: Interchange Improvements

Peak period traffic delays at Mitchell Freeway's northbound off-ramp to Neerabup Road are soon to be a thing of the past.

By March 2026, work will start on building a new free-flow left-turn lane from Mitchell Freeway northbound to Neerabup Road westbound.

The new left-turn lane will replace the existing give way system. It will allow traffic to flow directly into the westbound lane on Neerabup Road, resulting in travel time savings and eliminating congestion.

The project also includes underground drainage works and safety improvements to the pedestrian crossing facility.

This project is funded by the State Government, through Main Roads' Pinch Point Program.

Construction is expected to be complete by mid-2026.

What to expect during construction

The majority of construction work will be undertaken in the space between the existing roundabout and the Principal Shared Path (PSP), requiring minor detours for the safety of riders and walkers. Road users should expect traffic management and speed reductions on the off-ramp, which will be reduced to one lane only for the majority of the works.

Some after hours works for drainage and tie-ins, as well as off-ramp closures, will also be required and advertised in advance.
