

# Maylands Road Improvements: Have your say



We are planning a series of road improvements to enhance safety, connectivity and community amenity in Maylands following METRONET's closure of the Caledonian Avenue level crossing in the first half of 2022.

These improvements will make it safer for riders, walkers and road users to access the Maylands town centre

Considering existing and future traffic numbers, current pedestrian and cyclist movements, local development and predicted daily train boardings, we have developed a number of

preliminary concepts for finalisation and delivery over the next three to four years. They include:

- Traffic signals at the Guildford Road and Seventh Avenue intersection
- Pedestrian upgrades at the signalised intersection of Guildford Road and Eighth Avenue
- Two traffic lanes in each direction on Whatley Crescent, between Hotham Bridge and Garratt Road
- Traffic signals and a new right turn onto Whatley Crescent at the Hotham Bridge
- A new median on Railway Parade
- A roundabout at Whatley Crescent and Caledonian Avenue
- Reduced speeds and traffic calming in the Maylands town centre

The State Government has allocated \$15 million to this project.

## Community consultation: how to get involved

We are seeking nominations for a Community Reference Group (CRG) to work closely with Main Roads to refine the proposed road improvements.

The group will meet regularly over the next six months, providing input into the design process and representing the views of local residents and the business community.
