




Transport and Major Infrastructure Portfolio overview

The Transport and Major Infrastructure Portfolio works to create a better future for Western Australians through connected, resilient, safe and sustainable transport solutions. The following image details the structure of the Portfolio including the agencies and offices within the Portfolio and the specialist offices which provide support across the Portfolio.



Main Roads

Main Roads plans, builds, maintains and operates Western Australia's state road network, one of the largest geographically spread road networks in the world. Main Roads works to provide a safe, reliable and sustainable network of roads, bridges, paths and associated infrastructure. They operate from eight locations throughout the state supported by maintenance depots across regional areas. They are responsible for the State road network and their work includes:

- Planning and building WA's freeways, highways, bridges and paths.
- Maintenance and undertaking inspections, pavement resurfacing, line marking, drainage and fire control/vegetation.
- Capital projects and improvements to road, bridge and electrical infrastructure across WA.
- Managing real time operations including traffic signals, emergency response and real time traffic information.
- Regulating the movement and safety of heavy vehicles.
- Technical expertise in road design, geotechnical and traffic engineering, standards and road safety.

Public Transport Authority (PTA)

PTA is the primary supplier of public transport services in WA, responsible for:

- Rail, bus and ferry services in the metropolitan area
- Public transport services in regional centres
- Designing, building and maintaining transport infrastructure
- School bus services
- Coach and rail passenger services to regional areas
- Protecting the long-term viability of the State's freight rail corridor and infrastructure.

Department of Transport and Major Infrastructure (DTMI)

DTMI leads the development of safe, integrated and efficient transport systems to deliver on its purpose to empower a thriving Western Australian community. DTMI puts its customers at the heart of everything it does, coordinating the State's transport operations, strategic planning and policy development, and delivering safe and sustainable transport services and projects across all modes of transport – roads, railways, air travel, paths and waterways. DTMI services include:

- Providing driver and vehicle services (licensing)
- Regulating WA's on-demand transport industry
- State-wide transport planning
- Managing marine safety, coastal protection and facilities.

Office of Major Infrastructure Delivery (OMID)

OMID is part of the Department of Transport and Major Infrastructure (DTMI). The department leads the planning and delivering of major infrastructure projects that benefit all Western Australians - from new hospitals, sports and entertainment venues to transport upgrades and facilities for training, justice and research.

OMID will become a centre of excellence for planning and building high value (exceeding \$100 million), highly complex and/or high-risk major infrastructure projects across WA.

Office of Major Transport Infrastructure Delivery (OMTID)

OMTID was created by combining the knowledge in the transport portfolio to create a centre of excellence to deliver complex, multi modal transport infrastructure.

With projects spanning from the Great Southern to the Kimberley regions, OMTID aims to improve the wellbeing of current and future generations through community focused delivery of major transport infrastructure projects.

Westport

Westport is the State Government's planning program to move container trade from Fremantle to Kwinana. This includes planning a new port and the connected freight road, rail, and logistics operations.

By about 2040, the Fremantle Port and associated freight network will not have the capacity to service WA without major investment, which would not resolve issues in the longer term. Kwinana has long been identified as the best location for WA's major port. It is a heavy industrial area with a working port, has access to ten times more industrial land than Fremantle, and can accommodate new and safer freight corridors.

Westport is planning the new port and supply chain network to be ready when Fremantle meets capacity, to future proof container trade and WA's economy for 100 years.

Transport Portfolio Aboriginal Engagement (TPAE)

Established in July 2022, TPAAE works across the Transport and Major Infrastructure Portfolio and supports agencies to improve performance in Aboriginal economic participation, cultural recognition and workplace cultural safety. Key deliverables include:

- Improve contracting opportunities for Aboriginal businesses
- Support employment and training pathways
- Develop business capability for Aboriginal peoples
- Build relationships with education, training, employment and small business development providers, to create pathways for Aboriginal peoples to gain sustainable employment.
