1 Introduction

1.1 Project Background, Location and Status

Main Roads has completed the construction of the initial phase of Albany Ring Road (ARR) (the Project), which provides for the long-term transport needs of Western Australia's Great Southern Region. The ARR is a dedicated freight route around the City of Albany that enables the effective movement of freight to and from the Port of Albany. The ARR caters for the travel demands associated with growth in grain, woodchip and other agricultural industries, increased mining production, increased population growth, urban expansion and the expected increase in tourists.

The Project comprises the following components:

- Approximately 7 km of new dual carriage road
- Grade separated interchanges at South Coast Highway and Frenchman Bay Road
- Bridges and culverts
- Water retention basins and other drainage structures
- Landscaping and revegetation works
- Modifications to local roads
- Realignment to the Albany-Wagin railway line between George Street and the Hanrahan/Frenchman Bay Interchange
- Other road infrastructure including, but not limited to: lighting, noise barriers, fencing, road safety barriers, a fauna underpass and a rope bridge, and signs.

The construction of the initial phase of Project commenced on 21 February 2022, with the road being open to traffic in May 2024. The initial phase of the main project works were completed in October 2024.

1.2 Approval under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999

The Project was referred to the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (the Department) (then Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment (DAWE)) in August 2020 for assessment under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act). The Project was determined to be a Controlled Action on 1 October 2020 due to its potential impacts on listed threatened species and communities. On 17 June 2021, Main Roads submitted a variation request under section 156A of the EPBC Act to satisfy Parts 5.07 and 5.08 of the EPBC Regulations. Subsequently, on 27 July 2021, the Department accepted the variation to the proposal and issued a notice recording this decision. The Department granted conditional approval for the Project on 22 November 2021 (EPBC 2020/8769).

1.3 Purpose of this Report

This compliance report has been produced to satisfy Condition 14 of approval EPBC 2020/8769.

2 Summary of Compliance

Table 1 of this report details the Project's compliance status for each approval condition over the 12 month reporting period: 21 February 2024 to 20 February 2025.

During the 2023-24 reporting period, the Project was found to be non-compliant with Condition 3 of EPBC 2020/8769. This was due to Main Roads did not submitting an Offset Strategy for approval within 12 months of the commencement of action. Although the development of the Offset Strategy has progressed, the Offset Strategy is yet to be submitted.

2.1 Corrective measures

To address the non-compliance with Condition 3 of EPBC 2020/8769, Main Roads has instigated a number of corrective actions, including:

- actively seeking alternative offsets to meet the requirements of Condition 3 of the approval.
 Some of these actions include:
 - Acquisition of a 40ha agricultural property for the purpose of rehabilitation
 - Negotiations with landowners for future land acquisition
 - Installation of nine black cockatoo nesting hollows.

Additional information regarding the corrective actions and status regarding this non-compliance is provided in Table 1.

In addition to the corrective measures mentioned above, Main Roads has sought a request to vary this condition. Liaison with DCCEEW has been ongoing regarding this matter.

2.2 New Environmental Risks

No new environmental risks for the Project have become apparent during the reporting period.
