



Armadale Road and Eighth Road Intersection: Safety Improvements

The busy intersection of Armadale Road and Eighth Road is being upgraded to improve safety for road users and pedestrians.

This project will provide new traffic signals, CCTV for real-time traffic monitoring, extended turning lanes, new footpaths, safer pedestrian crossing facilities, new streetlighting and upgraded drainage. For safety reasons, Gray Road will be modified to left-in, left-out only at Eighth Road.

Service relocations will get underway from mid-2026 and roadworks will start before the end of the year. The project should be completed in early 2027.

This \$4.5 million project is funded by the State Government's Metropolitan Intersection Crash program. It is aimed at reducing

the high number of crashes at this busy location, which are largely associated with right-turn movements.

In 2014, a fatal crash tragically occurred at this location. In the most recent five-year period to December 2025, 53 crashes were recorded.

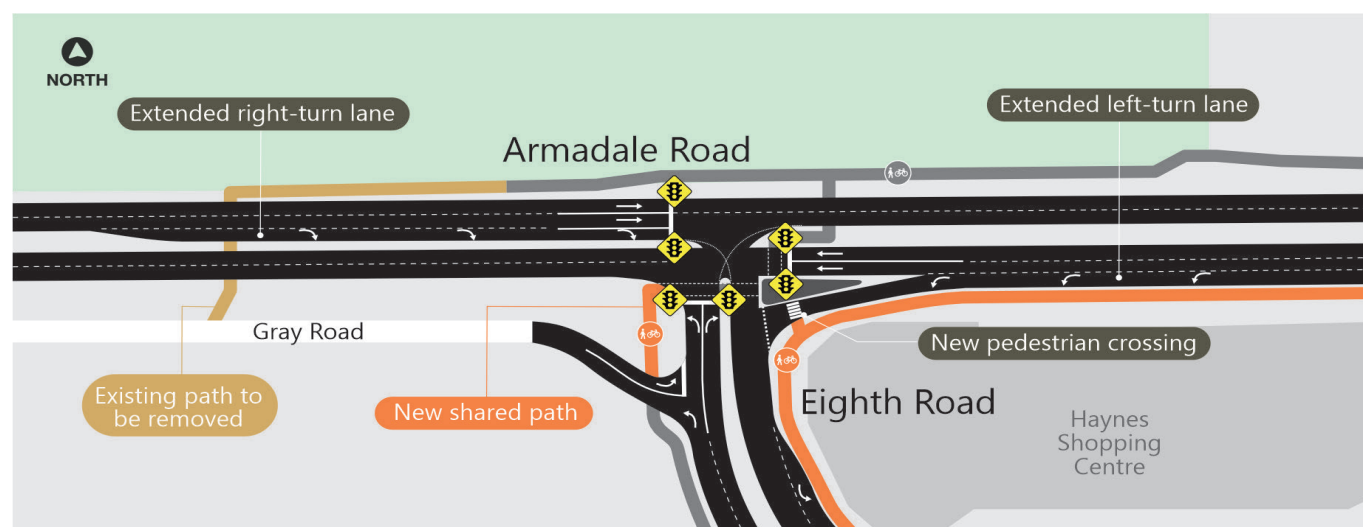
The intersection upgrade has also been designed to tie into the City of Armadale's future plans to transform Eighth Road into a dual carriageway, a key strategic route in the Wungong Development area.

What to expect during construction

Due to the busy nature of this intersection, the majority of service relocations and construction activity required to

complete this upgrade will be undertaken after hours. Every effort will be made to minimise disruption to nearby residents.

Road users should expect after hours lane closures, speed reductions and traffic management. Any intersection closures requiring traffic detours will be advertised in advance. Path closures and detours will also be required to ensure pedestrian safety during construction.
