




Scarborough Beach Road and Green Street Roundabout



Main Roads is planning for a significant upgrade at the intersection of Scarborough Beach Road and Green Street.

This project will replace the current twostage road crossing with a new dual-lane roundabout and pedestrian crossings. For safety reasons, Birrell Street will be modified to a cul-de-sac at Scarborough Beach Road.

This important safety project is funded by the State Government.

A number of intersection improvement options were assessed by expert road designers, who selected the roundabout

as the preferred engineering solution to address the safety issues at this busy location.

Why does this intersection need upgrading?

Between 2019 and 2023, there were 66 reported crashes at the current two-stage road crossing.

Just under a quarter of these resulted in medical attention or hospitalisation and more than three-quarters caused property damage.

Most of these crashes occurred during right-turns (more than 80 per cent) or as a result of rear-end collisions.

Project timeframe

To prepare for the new roundabout, a complex network of services such as Western Power and Telstra need to be relocated or protected.

This work is scheduled to start in mid-2024, with roundabout construction expected to get underway in the final quarter of the year.
