
Package tenders are issued to businesses registered with the BORR project as they become available.

Local business engagement update

As of 30 April 2024, committed spend with local businesses is \$559.2 million, which is 20 per cent above the targeted spend of \$450 million. Of this committed spend, \$456.1 million of this has been spent to date, which is above the targeted spend. So far, 356 local businesses have been engaged with on the project.

Amongst the Aboriginal industry, \$51.2 million has been committed, which is more than 70 per cent above the targeted spend of \$30 million. To date, \$42.4 million has been spent with Aboriginal businesses and 44 Aboriginal businesses have been engaged with on the project.



Beyond BORR business briefings wrap up

The project team held two Beyond BORR business briefings recently. Representatives from 13 local businesses attended, learning about the Yaka Dandjoo program and discussing opportunities and interest in employing program graduates looking for work beyond BORR.

Individuals from the local businesses were encouraged to meet with the team following the briefings to discuss their specific labour needs and which Yaka Dandjoo graduates may be suitable to fill those positions.

Local Business Advisory Group site tour

The Local Business Advisory Group took part in a site tour of the BORR project, driving down the alignment from the northern end of the project at Paris-Clifton Road to the southern end at Bussell Highway. They also took the opportunity to speak to some local businesses working on site.

The LBAG consists of 22 members, including individuals from 11 local businesses, representatives from the Bunbury Geographe Chamber of Commerce and Industry, employment and training facilitators, local and state government, the South West Development Commission, and the BORR team.

The group has been meeting since 2020 and has been instrumental in providing local solutions that have helped achieve positive local participation outcomes.

They have been achieving this by monitoring progress against the local business spend targets and discussing opportunities, issues, and/or barriers for local business participation.

The site tour was a great opportunity for the LBAG members to see first-hand the extensive local participation and hear some business success stories.
