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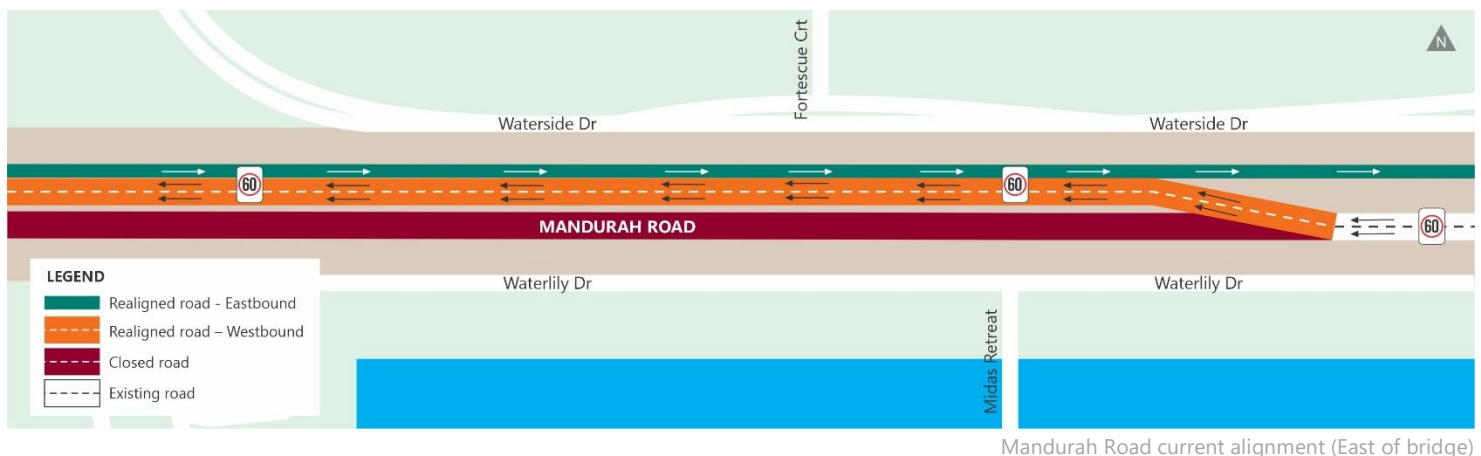
Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project Construction Update

This update contains important information about anticipated upcoming works to occur in June but are subject to change.

Mandurah Road modified conditions

Modified conditions will be ongoing throughout the coming months on both approaches to Mandurah Estuary Bridge. Currently a temporary lane alignment is now in effect with eastbound traffic remaining in one lane from Old Coast Road until near the Leslie Street intersection, with the lane moved closer to the road shoulder. Westbound traffic maintains two lanes, moving across the median strip after the Leslie Street intersection to the typical eastbound lanes. Updates will be provided through roadside messaging boards, the [Main Roads Travel Map](#) and the [Project Community Facebook page](#). Motorists are advised to observe traffic management in place and drive safely through the works.

Working outside of normal hours

- Early start times of 3.00am for setup, and 3.30am continue throughout the Project program in preparation for concrete pours and associated bridge segment works
- Split shifts between 5:00am – 9:00pm may occur for activities that enable concrete pours, steel-fixing, crane operations, grouting and segment launch set-up
- Ad-hoc works may occur on Sunday 8 June and if necessary, also on 22 June

What can I expect in June?

- Active plant, vehicles and machinery moving in and around all sections of the Project site
- Formwork, reinforcement and concrete works on the land-based bridge piers, pile caps and retaining walls

Waterside Drive (Northeast)

- Road and pavement finishing works (including fencing), drainage, landscaping, and street lighting works
- Noise wall anti-graffiti painting works (resident side)
- Works in preparation for feature lighting including electrical board and works on underpass footpath
- Amenity wall extension panel installation

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Waterlily Drive (Southeast)

- Ongoing operation of the casting bed
- Deliveries, concrete trucks/agitators, concrete boom-pumps, and general crane and forklift operations
- Bridge segment concrete pours and associated compaction and screeding equipment
- Survey, potholing and clearing works for amenity wall extensions
- Stockpiling of material for future use. Current northeast sand pile will move to the southeast
- Profiling works and commencement of road construction for the southeast quadrant future westbound road tie in and future maintenance access median crossover. This may also include drainage and electrical works.

Seahawk Drive (Southwest)

- General earthworks, electrical, fencing, drainage and embankment fill
- Amenity wall post and panel installation
- Roadworks and associated road furniture construction including pavements and street light poles
- Dewatering activities and equipment set up
- Wall painting including urban design to noise wall panels
- Works to the future bridge access staircase from Egret Road ongoing

Leisure Way/Egret Point Road area (Northwest)

- Intermittent closure of Egret Point Road for access to construction area
- Ongoing removal of the reclamation pad
- Concrete agitator truck/pump works at the western bridge abutment
- Installation of future drainage and other structures adjacent to the new bridge

Existing Bridge 1085

- Continued feature lighting installation works including vandal proof brackets and conduit works. Spotters will be in place to manage pedestrian/cyclist movement around the consolidated work area

In the estuary

- Ongoing new fishing platform construction including partial removal of the temporary eastern reclamation pad
- Removal of the western reclamation pad
- Bridge segment launching activities
- Vessel Management Plan remains in place with reduced width of navigation channel and a 5-knot speed limit

Further information

Jointly funded by the Australian and Western Australian Governments, the \$148.8 million Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication project is delivering a second, two-lane bridge on the south side of the existing structure to provide additional traffic lanes.

A new four-metre-wide shared footpath will also be built to help the local community better access recreational activities. An accessible fishing platform will also be provided on the eastern foreshore.
