What to do in an Emergency

➤ What if I break down?

If you're having mechanical issues or are involved in a minor crash, carefully drive your vehicle to the emergency lane or one of the signed emergency stopping bays.

On the Kwinana Freeway, between Canning Highway and the Narrows there are six signed emergency stopping bays at an average of 630m apart, or every 25 seconds.

➤ What if I can't get to the emergency lane?

Our smart freeways are monitored by operators in our 24/7 Road Network Operations Centre, so if something happens you will be seen.

If you can't get to the emergency lane, or an emergency stopping bay, stay in your vehicle, turn your hazard lights on and keep your seat belt fastened while you wait for the Incident Response team to arrive.

Remember our Operations Centre is constantly monitoring the freeway, so whether you enter a bay or stop on the freeway itself, you will be seen.

If your car is stationary, you can also call 138 138 and speak to our customer information centre. Or you can use one of our on site help phones located at all our emergency stopping bays on the Kwinana Freeway.

When a vehicle stops on our Smart Freeways, it will be detected within minutes. If necessary, action will be taken to adjust speeds, close lanes and deploy an Incident Response Vehicle.
