# 1 Introduction

### 1.1 Project Background, Location and Status

Main Roads Western Australia (Main Roads) upgraded approximately 11km of Albany Highway between 254.9 – 266.0 Straight Line Kilometres (SLK), immediately south of the Kojonup town site for the purpose of improving road safety (the Project). The scope of work comprised vegetation clearing, earthworks, culvert installation, drainage works and pavement widening. Main Roads' Great Southern Region delivered the project over two years, with construction completed in 2020. A total of 4.63 ha of native vegetation of the approved 5.5ha was cleared for this Project.

### 1.2 Approval under Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999

Main Roads' Great Southern Region proposed to clear vegetation for the Project subject to a bilateral agreement made under Section 45 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act). The Project was referred to the former Department of the Environment and Energy (the Department) in 2017 (our ref D18#414359) and determined to be a Controlled Action due to its potential impacts on listed threatened species. In 2018, the project was altered due to its extension further south to SLK 266 and a variation request was made under section 156A of the EPBC Act. The Department granted approval to Main Roads to clear native vegetation for the Kojonup South Project (the Action) through the EPBC 2017-7934 approval dated 26 February 2019 (our ref D19#153882), which included a number of conditions that Main Roads is required to fulfil.

No vegetation clearing nor works using the EPBC Approval 2017-7934 were undertaken during the current reporting period (22 May 2024 to 22 May 2025).

In accordance with Condition 4 of the EPBC 2017-7934 approval, Main Roads advised the Department on 29 May 2019 that the Action commenced on 22 May 2019 (our ref D19#434770).

### 1.3 Purpose of this Report

This compliance report has been produced to satisfy Conditions 8 of approval EPBC 2017-7934.

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# 2 Summary of Compliance

Construction was completed in 2020 and no vegetation clearing was undertaken during the current reporting period (22 May 2024 to 22 May 2025).

No new non-compliances occurred during the reporting period, noting Main Roads has been working with the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW).

**Table 1** of this report outlines project compliance necessary during the reporting period.

### 2.1 Corrective measures

No corrective or remedial actions were deemed required and no environmental impacts occurred as a result of the non-compliance with Condition 3 of EPBC 2017/7934.

### 2.2 New Environmental Risks

No new environmental risks for the Project have become apparent during the reporting period.

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To compensate for the loss of up to 5.5 hectares of black cockatoo habitat, the approval holder must, by 23 May 2023:

a. submit to the Minister for approval the details of an offset site(s) that:

- I. is to be acquired and managed for conservation and
- II. includes a minimum of 39 ha of black cockatoo habitat or is to be rehabilitated/revegetated so that (within a timeframe agreed to by the Minister) it contains 39 ha of black cockatoo habitat and
- III. meets the principles of the EPBC Environmental Offsets Policy and

b. either:

- I. make a financial contribution to an approved conservation fund to fully fund the purchase and management for conservation of the approved offset site(s) or
- II. fully fund the rehabilitation/revegetation of the approved offset site(s), to satisfy the requirements of condition 3.a. ii. and iii.

c. if option 3.b.i. is adopted, provide written evidence to the Department that the financial contribution has been made to the approved conservation fund.

The approval holder must, within 20 business days of the Minister's approval of the offset site(s), provide the Department with the offset attributes, shapefiles and textual descriptions and maps to clearly define the location and boundaries of the approved offset site(s).

In February 2019, Main Roads complied with Condition 3b of EPBC 2017/7934 by making a financial contribution of \$174,330 to the WA Department of Environment and Water Regulation (DWER) to fully fund the purchase and management of an approved offset site. Evidence of the payment was provided to (then) DAWE on 11 June 2020, as per Condition 3c of EPBC 2017/7934.

Partially Compliant In early 2023, DWER identified Lot 2 on Deposited Plan 416249, Kojonup as being suitable to purchase to offset the impacts from EPBC 2017/7934. Although both DWER and the WA Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA) were working towards completing the acquisition before 22 May 2023, DWER advised it was not able to guarantee that the acquisition would be completed before this date. Given this uncertainty, Main Roads sought clarification from DCCEEW on 18 May 2023 regarding whether Main Roads should seek another extension to ensure it remained in compliance with EPBC 2017/7934. No response was received.

Given DWER and DBCA had not finalised the acquisition of the offset site using the funds Main Roads provided to acquire an offset site by 22 May 2023, Main Roads was not able to provide the offset site details to the Department by 22 May 2023. Accordingly, Main Roads advised the Department on 12 April 2024 that it was non-compliant with Conditions 3a and 3d of EPBC 2017/7934.
