



Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project Construction Update

This update contains important information about anticipated upcoming works to occur in October but are subject to change.

Egret Point Road Closure

From Monday, 13 October to Saturday, 8 November 2025, part of Egret Point Road will be closed while we complete construction of the western abutment and deliver amenity upgrades to the western foreshore.

During this time:

- local traffic west of the existing bridge will be detoured to Old Coast Road from Bower Drive;
- local traffic east of the bridge will be detoured via Leisure Way (see map opposite); and
- pedestrians and cyclists will still have access under the bridge via a temporary footpath.

Timing of the work is subject to favourable weather conditions. Please refer to on-road and path signage

for the latest information. We understand that works can be disruptive, and we appreciate your patience and understanding while we complete these essential works. Up to date information is available on the Main Roads website and Travel Map.



Traffic realignment on Mandurah Road western approach

Due to recent wet weather, the traffic realignment on the western approach has been rescheduled to October 2025, to allow clearing for amenity walls in the northeast section of the project. From 24 October 2025, all westbound traffic will be directed onto the new approach road after the existing bridge, continuing to the Old Coast Road intersection.

Meanwhile, eastbound traffic will remain in the right-hand lane after the merge point from Old Coast Road then move into the left-hand lane before crossing over the bridge. This will allow room for the installation of the new amenity walls adjacent to Leisure Way and build the new median strip between old and new bridge approaches.







Upcoming nightworks

From 22 – 24 October 2025, 7pm to 5am, nightworks are required to set up the new alignment. A detour will be in place for eastbound traffic (towards Perth) with traffic diverted via Old Coast Road and Pinjarra Road.

Westbound traffic will be reduced to one lane over Mandurah Estuary Bridge during this time. Motorists are urged to adhere to road signage and observe the 60km/h speed limit.



Please note that these works are weather dependent and subject to change.

Working outside of normal hours

- Split shifts between 5:00am 9:00pm may occur for activities that enable concrete pours, crane operations and bituminous pavement works. These works may occur on Sundays throughout October if necessary (weather dependent).
- Nightworks to complete installation of light poles and cabling to northeast and northwest quadrants.

What can I expect in October?

Waterside Drive (Northeast)

- Removal of the existing site compound to enable works on the future fishing platform car park.
- Existing children's playground area remains closed until early next year.
- Finishing works in and around the walls, including stone-pitching to drainage pipes and headwalls.

Waterlily Drive (Southeast)

- Ongoing deliveries and general crane and forklift operations.
- Construction of the eastern approach slab (onto the new bridge) and completion of the new fishing platform.
- Road pavement construction for the new westbound road tie in and maintenance access median crossover. This will also include associated drainage and electrical works.
- Widening of the footpath to tie in with the 4m wide shared path that runs under the new bridge.
- Completion of the noise walls.
- Anti-graffiti painting.

Seahawk Drive (Southwest)

- General earthworks, electrical, fencing, drainage, and embankment fill.
- Roadworks, bituminous surfacing (asphalt application) and associated road furniture construction including street lighting and barrier works.
- Construction of the western approach slab (off the new bridge).
- Anti-graffiti painting.
- Box culvert pavement tie-in to Seahawk Drive.
- Precast panel construction for new bridge abutment.

Leisure Way/Egret Point Road area (Northwest)

- Full closure of Egret Point Road from Monday 13 October until 8 November 2025.
- Concrete agitator truck/pump works at the western bridge abutment.
- Finishing works within the western foreshore, rock pitching and installation of the permanent fence and gates.
- Minor clearing along the western foreshore for footpath connecting carpark to yarning circle.
- Clearing and CFA piling for amenity wall construction near the intersection of Old Coast Road.

In the estuary

- Finishing works to the new fishing platform installation of handrail, ladders and platform furniture.
- Removal of the old fishing platform connection and stairs due to safety concerns.

- Bearing changeover works replacing all the temporary bearings out for permanent ones on all the piers.
- Barges will be working in the water with no impact to the navigation channel.
- Anti-graffiti painting to the piers.
- Removal of scaffolding and temporary walkways from the pier columns.
- Vessel Management Plan remains in place with reduced width of navigation channel and a 5-knot speed limit including any general maintenance required to the channel markers/buoys.

Further information

Funded by the Australian and Western Australian Governments, the \$148.8 million Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project is delivering a second, two-lane bridge on the south side of the existing structure, increasing connectivity, reducing congestion and improving road user safety.

The Project also enhances the location as a recreational area, delivering an accessible fishing platform, yarning circles on both eastern and western foreshores, an improved accessible shared path network, programmable feature lighting and urban design elements.
