EastLink WA is a culmination of more than 40 years of road planning activities to provide a safer, more efficient route between Perth and Northam for freight and road users. Planning and development is taking place over three years to produce preliminary designs for the route.

EastLink WA Planning and development is jointly funded by the Australian Government (\$10 million) and Western Australian Government (\$10 million).

Between January and June 2022, the community provided feedback on the preliminary designs for EastLink WA with a focus on the access and connectivity of the proposed highway and adjacent road network. We invited feedback on:

- What's important to the community through our community survey
- The access point locations (Phase 1 interactive map)
- Highway connectivity (Phase 2 interactive map); and
- How the community use and experience the Kep Track.

Thank you to those who provided feedback online via our consultation website My Say Transport, in-person at our drop-in sessions and through our project enquiries channels.

We received feedback about a range of factors, reflecting diverse views within the community. This feedback is being considered alongside environmental, heritage, engineering, and land-use constraints and requirements to refine the Access Strategy and ultimate design concepts, which considers forecasted 2051 traffic volumes for the highway.
