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1 Introduction

1.1 Project Background and Status

Main Roads Western Australia (Main Roads) is currently undertaking widening and passing lanes works on Brand Highway between 34.83-164.3 Straight Line Kilometres (SLK), in the Shire of Gingin and Shire of Dandaragan (the Project). The improvements are intended to improve the safety of Brand Highway by providing safe overtaking opportunities and improving the functionality of the road.

The Main Roads Mid-West Gascoyne Region is delivering the Project in stages based on funding availability. Project implementation commenced on 11 December 2019. Main Roads notified the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment (the Department) of action (the Project) commencement in writing on 12 December 2019.

No construction or clearing activities were undertaken during the reporting period (11 December 2021 to 11 December 2022).

1.2 Approval under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999

The Project was referred to the Department in January 2017 for assessment under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act). The Project was determined to be a Controlled Action on 16 March 2017 due to its potential impacts on listed threatened species and communities. The Department granted approval for the Project on 25 September 2019 (EPBC 2017/7864), which included a number of conditions that Main Roads is required to fulfil.

1.3 Purpose of this Report

This compliance report has been produced to satisfy Condition 13 of approval EPBC 2017/7864.

Table 1 of this report details the Project's compliance with regard to each approval condition over the 12 month reporting period: 11 December 2021 to 11 December 2022. Conditions deemed completed are shaded grey.

Further reductions on site enabled a smaller area to be cleared than approvals allowed. For example, the clearing
