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1 INTRODUCTION

Main Roads Western Australia (Main Roads) is upgrading three sections of York-Merredin Road, in the Avon Wheatbelt region of Western Australia between Straight Line Kilometre (SLK) 1.95 and SLK 51.

Gradual and steady increases in traffic levels along the York-Merredin Road have occurred as a result of increased grain freight movements in the area. This has increased the volume of vehicles using the York-Merredin Road to access the Co-operative Bulk Handling bins in the area. The width of the existing road is unsuitable for the increased traffic and works have commenced to improve the road geometry and general road safety attributes along this section of road.

The Project consists of the following key components:

- Road widening for three sections of road.
- The extension of 24 culverts, one new culvert and the upgrade of 13 existing culverts with wider culverts in the first section (1.95 SLK to 15 SLK).
- The replacement of six culverts and extension of 10 culverts in the second section (19 SLK to 29 SLK).
- The replacement of 21 culverts, extension of 26 and one new culvert in the third section (29 SLK to 51 SLK).

1.1 Approval under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation* Act 1999

The Project was referred to the former Department of the Environment (now the Department of the Environment and Energy (the Department)) for assessment under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) due to its potential impacts on the listed threatened species Carnaby's Black Cockatoo (*Calyptorhynchus latirostris*) and the Red-tailed Phascogale (*Phascogale calura*). The Department granted approval of the Project on 15 November 2016 (EPBC 2015/7536), which included a number of conditions that Main Roads is required to fulfil.

1.2 Purpose of this Report

Clearing for the Project commenced on 29 November, 2016. This compliance report has been produced to satisfy Condition 6 of approval EPBC 2015/7536. Table 1 of this report outlines project compliance against each approval condition over the 12 month period 29 November 2016 to 29 November 2017.

2 COMPLIANCE




Figure 1a - York - Merredin Clearing undertaken during Reporting Period

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


Figure 1c - York - Merredin Clearing undertaken during Reporting Period

Figure 1d - York - Merredin Clearing undertaken during Reporting Period



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



Figure 1e - York - Merredin Clearing undertaken during Reporting Period

Figure 1f - York - Merredin Clearing undertaken during Reporting Period






Figure 1g - York - Merredin Clearing undertaken during Reporting Period

York-Merredin Road Widening and Upgrade (EPBC 2015/7536) - Provision of Offset attributes and shapefile

The Department of the Environment and Energy (the Department) approved the upgrade of York-Merredin Road between Straight Line Kilometres 1.95 and 51 on 15 November 2016 (EPBC 2015/7536). The approval required offsetting the project impacts on habitat for Carnaby's black cockatoo (*Calyptorhynchus latirostris*) and the Red-tailed phascogale (*Phascogale calura*). Condition 2a of EPBC 2015/7536 required Main Roads to make a financial contribution to the WA DER Offsets Fund to fully fund the purchase of an offset site containing a minimum of 261ha of Carnaby's black cockatoo foraging habitat and potential breeding trees and habitat for the Red-tailed phascogale. On 30 November 2016 Main Roads provided written evidence to the Department that a financial contribution had been made to the WA Offsets Fund, and that the action had commenced on 29 November 2016.

The Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) has notified Main Roads that the offset site for the York-Merredin Road Widening and Upgrade project has now been acquired and will be managed by the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions for the purposes of conservation. The shapefile and an Excel spreadsheet summarising the attributes of the offset site is attached in accordance with the requirements of Condition 3 of EPBC 2015/7536.

Condition 2 of EPBC 2015/7536 stipulates that the purchased offset site must contain a minimum of 261 ha of Carnaby's black cockatoo foraging habitat and potential breeding trees, and habitat for the Red-tailed phascogale. DWER has advised that the offset site for the York Merredin Road Widening and Upgrade project comprises 365.94 ha of remnant native vegetation that provides suitable foraging, nesting and roosting habitat for black cockatoos as well as suitable foraging and breeding habitat for the Red-tailed phascogale. Large trees with hollows were reportedly observed regularly within the site. The selected offset site is therefore considered to satisfy the offset characteristics required under Condition 2.

The offset of 365.94 ha for the York Merredin Road Widening and Upgrade project forms part of a larger offset site comprising 401.4 ha in total. The additional 41.46 ha meets the offset requirements for other Main Roads projects and demonstrates the benefits of a strategic approach to offsets facilitated by DWER.
