



## **Restricted Access Vehicle (RAV) Classes**

## **Class 1 RAVs**

Regulation 190 of the *Road Traffic (Vehicles) Regulations 2014* defines a *Class 1 vehicle* as one that by itself or together with its load, exceeds a prescribed mass or dimension limit and it is:

- a special purpose vehicle; or
- an agricultural machine or agricultural implement; or
- carrying, or designed to carry, a large indivisible item;

But it is *not* a road train. B-Double or carrying a multi-modal freight container.






## **Class 2 RAVs**


Section 38 of the Road Traffic (Vehicles) Act 2012 defines a complying restricted access vehicle as a vehicle that complies with all prescribed mass and dimension limits and is prescribed as a Class 2 vehicle under Regulation 203 of the Road Traffic (Vehicles) Regulations 2014. A Class 2 vehicle includes:

- a Controlled Access Bus; and
- a B-Double; and
- a Road Train; and
- a Livestock Carrier; and
- a multi deck Car Carrier.



## **Class 3 RAVs**

Regulation 190 of the *Road Traffic (Vehicles) Regulations 2014* defines a *Class 3 vehicle* as one that exceeds a prescribed dimension and/or mass limit and is not a *Class 1 vehicle* or *Class 2 vehicle*.
