

# High Street Upgrade Stirling Highway to Carrington Street

## Pedestrian and cyclist detours

As part of the High Street Upgrade, a number of pedestrian detours will be required. Detours will be ongoing until mid-2021 and will be updated as works progress.

We understand the inconvenience detours may cause and appreciate your patience while we upgrade High Street and Stirling Highway to improve safety, freight efficiency and traffic flow for road users travelling to and from Fremantle.

### Stirling Highway

From March 2020 crossings at Holland and Forrest Streets, including the Forrest Street Children's Crossing, have been closed to commence construction of the Forrest Street underpass.

Pedestrians and cyclists are currently being detoured via Marmion Street or High Street.

### Forrest Street Children's Crossing

The Children's Crossing at Forrest Street was closed in March and the crossing point has now been detoured via the signalised Marmion Street and Stirling Highway intersection.

An alternative crossing route will be in place for pedestrians and cyclists who would prefer to cross Stirling Highway via the George Street underpass (see map overleaf for further details).

### Crossing at signalised intersections

When crossing at signalised intersections, please cross with care and:

- Press the traffic signal button - this will extend the crossing period
- Wait until the light ahead of you turns green to cross

- Stay alert - look and listen for traffic as you cross
- Do not cross when the light directly in front of you is red.

## High Street near Wood Street

To relocate services currently running along the southern verge of High Street and Wood Street (south), pedestrians and cyclists will be detoured via Montreal and Amherst Streets.

### Signage

Directional signage will be installed along the detour routes to guide pedestrians and cyclists. Signs including maps and further details will also be located at strategic points along the detours.

### Resident and road user precautions

Road users are asked to take extra care when driving along the detour routes:

- Look out for pedestrians and cyclists at all times
- Take extra care when exiting and entering driveways
- On bin day, place rubbish bins carefully to avoid obstructing the footpath.
