

Stock Road-Beeliar Drive Intersection Upgrade

About the project

We are planning to upgrade the busy intersection of Stock Road and Beeliar Drive, in the City of Cockburn.

This important project will improve safety by providing exclusive pedestrian crossing facilities, stopping all traffic movements and allowing riders and walkers to cross the intersection under signal control.

Traffic flow will also be improved with new lanes on all approaches, new and extended turning pockets and upgraded traffic signals. Safety barriers will be installed on the western corners of the intersection and street lighting will also be upgraded. To accommodate the upgraded intersection layout, bus stops and footpaths will need to be relocated.

This \$7 million project is funded by the State Government.

Timeframe

Western Power has already removed overhead power lines and relocated underground services to prepare for this project. We have invited tenders from industry and expect to award a contract by September 2020. Work is likely to start in October 2020 and the upgrade will take approximately six months to complete.

What to expect during construction

To avoid major traffic disruption, this work will largely be completed at night, with occasional day works where feasible. Lane closures and speed reductions will be in place while the work is completed.

Nightworks will be undertaken in accordance with a Noise Management Plan, approved by the City of Cockburn.

Tree replacement

Clearing is required on the north-west and south-east corners of the intersection, to allow for road widening. We have already committed to providing funding to the City of Cockburn to replace these trees within the local area.

Fencing on Beeliar Drive

Where clearing occurs on Beeliar Drive, we will provide new 2.1 metre Colourbond rear fencing for properties to retain privacy and amenity. Installation of this new fence will be coordinated with residents to minimise disruption.

Pre-construction building surveys

Before starting major construction work, our nominated contractor will offer building condition surveys to properties close to the site. These offers will be made in writing. If you are offered a survey, we encourage you to accept this offer as it is your protection in the unlikely event of any damage to your property during construction.
