





This update contains information regarding the current and future works happening on the Bunbury Outer Ring Road (BORR) project. Information in this update is current as of March 2023 and is subject to change. Project update

Construction of the Bunbury Outer Ring Road project is now over 40% complete.

After the first bridge beam lift was completed in February, preparations have been underway for the next beam installation, which will occur in May at the Paris Road and Clifton Road interchange.

In the next few weeks, production will start on the next round of bridge beams, which will be used at the South West Highway (north) interchange later in the year. These will be manufactured at the purpose-built pre-cast yard in Picton East. The purpose of the bridge beams is to directly support the weight of the bridge and any traffic travelling over it.

This month, piling works commenced at the Collie River bridges. This process involves a piling rig using a large drill to bore into the ground and is essential to establishing strong bridge foundations. The rig drills a hole before a steel cage is dropped in and filled with concrete.

At the 'mega-bridge', piling for the piers has been completed, with the work for the two abutments remaining. The 'mega-bridge' will take BORR over Golding Crescent, the Ferguson River, the freight rail line, and Boyanup-Picton Road. It will be 382 metres long, making it the longest bridge in the South West region of Western Australia.

It's a bridge!

The project recently achieved a significant construction milestone, with the first set of 12 'tee-roff' beams for the Raymond Road interchange installed across two days. Teeroff beams enable the construction of stronger bridges with longer spans, using less material while also reducing overall bridge load.
