



Bunbury Outer Ring Road



The \$852 million Bunbury Outer Ring Road project is fully funded by the Australian Government (\$681.6 million) and the State Government (\$170.4 million).

The Bunbury Outer Ring Road (BORR) will reduce local congestion and increase efficiency for freight vehicles and regional traffic, while improving long-term access to the Bunbury Port. The project will support social and economic growth and development, enhance amenity on local roads by reducing freight and regional traffic, and create a safer road system for our community in Greater Bunbury and the South West region.

The South West Gateway Alliance and Main Roads are adhering to all Government restrictions put in place on 31 January 2021. In line with Government advice, we will continue construction this week. The health and safety of our people and the community remains our number one priority and we will follow restrictions and safety precautions including wearing mandatory masks, maintaining social distancing, temperature testing, limiting staff movements between regions, and increased site cleaning. Ground breaking event marks start of construction for BORR

Construction of the 27-kilometre four-lane, high-standard road from Forrest Highway near Australind to Bussell Highway, south of Bunbury, is now underway.

WA Transport Minister Rita Saffioti took part in a ground breaking ceremony for the project along with Nola Marino, Assistant Minister for Regional Development and Territories and local Member for Forrest; local Members Mick Murray and Don Punch; and Wardandi - Wilman Elders Yvonne Garlett and Peter Michael.

Work on the South West's biggest road infrastructure project will unlock thousands of local jobs and economic benefits for the Greater Bunbury region.

First will be access roads and lay down yards for the construction of the interchange at Willinge Drive. This junction with BORR will provide improved freight access to Bunbury Port.

Cultural ceremony a profound experience for the BORR Alliance team

The South West Gateway Alliance (SWGA) team had the pleasure of joining the project's Aboriginal Heritage Advisory Group (AHAG) on the BORR alignment for a profound cultural ceremony.

This was an opportunity for local Elders to be on land and to undertake a significant cultural activity prior to the start of work. The group gathered in a yarning circle under the shade of the peppermint tree to listen to the stories and experiences along the journey of BORR, and how this has impacted on the local Noongar people.

The preservation of heritage and culture, including song lines and stories is important and there was wide recognition and acknowledgement for all the Elders who have been on this 25-year journey and who are no longer with us.

Elder Joseph (Joe) Northover shared stories about the local Noongar people and their connection to the land, the waterways and the spirits of the Noongar Ancestors.

Those present experienced a powerful and moving 'waking of the spirits' ceremony and will now have the opportunity to build a greater understanding of Noongar people and culture.

Other AHAG members joined Joe in talking about where they lived and grew up along the BORR alignment.

Shortly afterwards, the AHAG met with the SWGA to review the Aboriginal Heritage Management Plan.
