

Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication Project

Early works to start on new bridge

Early works are due to start on the Mandurah Estuary Bridge Duplication project by the end of the year. The project involves the construction of a second, two-lane bridge next to the current bridge, as well as the construction of a universally accessible recreational fishing platform.

Starting towards the end of November/early December 2023, the construction team will begin underground service locating in the areas indicated on the map below. You may notice the small white conduits which the team will place in the ground indicating where the services are located. These conduits will stay for the duration of the project. This work will take three to four works to complete.

Geotechnical testing will also be undertaken in the same area. This testing checks the soil properties before construction begins. This work will start in December and take approximately two weeks to complete.

Minimal vegetation in this area will be cleared from late November into December 2023. Initial clearing will be undertaken for the early works, but further clearing will be required to allow for construction of the new bridge.

To minimise impact on road users, surveying of the road may be undertaken during night shift under traffic management. Night works, which are subject to approval, could take up to four nights to complete in late November into early December 2023.

Please note that vegetation will only be cleared if deemed necessary. Residents may hear some noise during early works, but it will be kept to a minimum. On the back of this page, there are details for a community Open House event to find out more information about the project.
