

Transforming our Southern Suburbs Road Network

On 7 May 2017, the State and Commonwealth Governments announced a \$2.3billion package of road and rail infrastructure works, which will reduce congestion and lead to smarter, safer and more efficient journeys around our suburbs.

As part of this package, seven major road projects will be constructed in Perth's southern suburbs over the coming years. These complementary projects will remove bottlenecks from our road network, improve access to and from Kwinana Freeway and improve freeway capacity from Russell Road to the Narrows Bridge.

Upon completion, they will support major public transport improvements such as the METRONET Cockburn to Thornlie rail extension and provide better options for commuters and for those who traverse our suburbs on a daily basis.

Managing construction

The timing and delivery of each project will be carefully managed by Main Roads to minimise disruption. Advanced notification of all works will be provided to local residents and road users whenever possible.

Community engagement

Main Roads is committed to working closely with the community through the development and delivery of each project. Our community engagement teams on each respective project will engage directly with local residents, business owners, amenity groups and landowners to ensure any concerns are identified and appropriately managed.

In addition, the local community will be able to access timely project information in a range of ways – through newsletters, dedicated web pages and information sessions.

Armadale Road Upgrade

Armadale Road between Anstey Road and Tapper Avenue will be widened from one to two lanes in each direction, reducing congestion and improving journey times on the last remaining section of single carriageway on Armadale Road.

Armadale Road to North Lake Road Bridge

A bridge between Armadale Road and North Lake Road will bypass congestion at Cockburn Central and Gateway Shopping Centre, and improve access to Kwinana Freeway northbound.

Kwinana Freeway Northbound Widening

Kwinana Freeway northbound between Russell Road and Roe Highway will be widened from two to three lanes, removing a major bottleneck around Cockburn Central.

Smart Freeways - Kwinana Freeway northbound

Smart Freeway technology will be used for the first time to create an additional lane from Canning Highway to the Narrows Bridge, and close and reopen lanes in response to incidents, while safely managing traffic flow at all times. The project will be complemented with coordinated ramp signals from Farrington Road to Cranford Avenue to make merging easier and reducing stop-start traffic conditions.

Murdoch Drive Connection

Murdoch Drive will be extended from Farrington Road to Kwinana Freeway and Roe Highway to reduce congestion on South Street and improve access to Fiona Stanley Hospital and the Murdoch Activity Centre.

Karel Avenue Upgrade

The intersection of Karel Avenue and Roe Highway will be upgraded to improve access to Jandakot Airport and the surrounding industrial area.

Manning Road On-Ramp to Kwinana Freeway southbound

A new on-ramp at Manning Road will improve access to Kwinana Freeway southbound and reduce congestion and rat running in South Perth.
